- 2. Brief review of activities conducted in the college during 2014-15 session:

i. CPE and Star College Scheme Status:

The College was conferred 'Colleges with Potential for Excellence' status by the UGC during the year 2006 and the CPE status has been continued and has entered the 3rd Phase in 2014. The college is also received STAR College Scheme grants from the Department of Biotechnology, Ministry of Science and Technology, Govt. of India. 9 (nine) Science Departments are supported under this scheme.

ii. Institutional Biotech hub:

The Biotech Hub organised a One-month Internship Programme on 'Basic Plant Tissue Culture Techniques with Bioinstrumentation & Bioinformatics' from 25th May to 25th June 2014.

iii. DBT-Bioinformatics (DBT-BIF) Centre:
