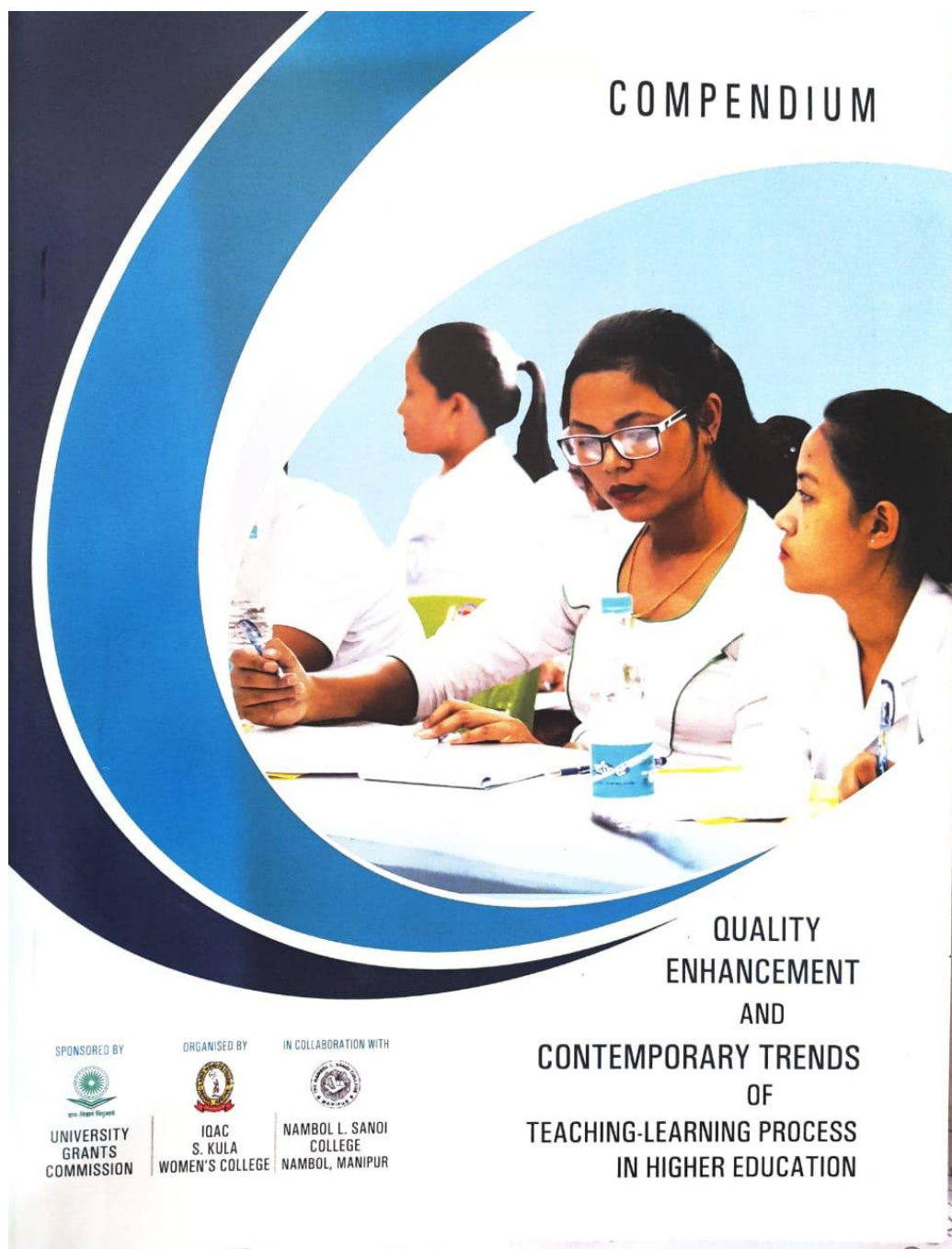

It is more unfortunate in the conflict regions like India's northeast where different ethnic organisations and civil societies used to use bandh and blockade as easiest way of demand to achieve their aspiration which is a big challenge in the quality education. Significantly, some changes are also evolved that some organisations have been relaxed educational institutes from such unwanted bandh and blockade but fruitful result is not yet coming up. So far, internal quality assessment system is not effective in the backdrop of conflict situation. Internal Quality Assurance Cells in different higher institutes are also in unfortunate that they cannot act accordingly due to various factors. Perhaps, it may be great hurdle in accredited institutes for reaccreditation. Though undergraduate institute are considered relatively better from higher institutes in Manipur in particular, many innovative approaches cannot implement in the college level, for why?

In such a situation, it is very pertinent to look in to the matter to initiate a new mechanism of teaching-learning to suit such social chaos. In the backdrop of many issues, due to the shortage of electric power the colleges could not effectively apply the innovative techniques of ICT in higher education. Indeed many types of equipment are still lying in idle without getting its potential utility. Alternative arrangement for power supply may be arranged but it cannot last long with a view to sustain quality education as essence of ICT became normal method of teaching-learning. Besides, handling such new equipments is also very problematic in senior teaching community except very few in many higher institutions. It is indeed a handicap, so intension and willingness to handle with a progressive way is urgent need. Different schemes are also provided to learn computer and ICT but we cannot expect the fruitful outcome due to lack of willingness and intensions. In general, many students and teachers too cannot understand utility and capability of internet in the higher education while many global students and faculty members taking in to consider using internet as one of the most essential approach for higher education and research. At the same time, it is also dangerous in academic sphere if the user do not understand available e-sources on the grounds of its validity, authenticity and genuine. That is why plagiarism became unacceptable phenomena in various research outputs of different universities. With this perspective, the proposed seminar can give an insight to understand the present phenomena that prevail in conflict states. It is also believed that concerned authority can formulate some suitable approach for sustainability and enhancement of quality education in such states. With this view the technical sessions will be on the following subthemes: Quality education: Issues and challenges in conflict region; Internal quality assessment system: Role of IQAC to sustain and enhance quality education; Innovative practice and approach: essence of ICT and Internet in higher education.

**Exacerbating Ethics is Antithesis to Quality Education:
An Overview**

This paper starts by contextualizing the current trend of increasing unethical practices that antithesis to quality education. Many commission, committee, policies were setup to improve Indian education system, but the improvement is not satisfactory because due to less weightage is given to values and morals. Indian students are self-centered and their prime target is 'job security' in lieu of 'job giver'. Method of analysis is mainly based on empirical and review of literature while the universe of the study is entire Indian states. The prime target of the analysis is to observe different activities of concerned stakeholders that relate ethics and quality education; to query is it possible to bring quality education by good infrastructure, well policy, curriculum, incentives without proper code of ethics. Several factors like corruption, political interference in education and other state of exacerbating ethical activities of the academic authority, which are pivotal factor for deteriorating education system in India are reviewed. The finding reveals that only when the stockholders like teacher, students, guardian and authority act according to ethical norms the matter of quality education will be unquestionable.
