Altogether 16 research papers were presented and 86 participants were in the workshop.



In the welcoming address Dr. S. Bhogendra, Nodal Officer, AISHE & HOD, Sociology, S. Kula Women's College stated that Gender is a social construct, so, we can bring change the understanding of gender by changing our mind set and socio-cultural background of our society. So, I do hope the workshop will bring a logical discussion on the topic so that the society could enable to bring the solution of the social pathology regarding gender issues.



Introducing the theme of the workshop Dr. W. Kunjarani Chanu, Director, Women's Studies Centre and Convenor of the workshop said that The issue of Gender Equality and economic empowerment has been subject matter of intense debate the social scientist gender activities and intellectual particularly in the contest of the new emerging. However, gender roles vary greatly from one culture to another and from one social, political, and economic group to another within the same culture. Despite many Government's gender centric plans and policies were implemented, it is still yet to achieve, gender equality in all sphere of life. In other words gender equality is intrinsically linked to sustainable development and is vital to the realization of human rights for all. Overall objective of gender equality is a society in which women and men enjoy the same opportunities rights and obligations in all spheres of life.



Giving the keynote address L. Muhindro (Nodal officer: UGC University Activity Monitoring Portal, SKWC) stated that Twenty-five years since the adoption of the Beijing

Declaration and Platform for Action—a progressive roadmap for gender equality—it's time to take stock of progress and bridge the gaps that remain through bold, decisive actions. The Generation Equality campaign is bringing together people of every gender, age, ethnicity, race, religion and country, to drive actions that will create the gender-equal world we all deserve. Together, we want to mobilize to end gender-based violence; we are calling for economic justice and rights for all; bodily autonomy, sexual and reproductive health and rights; and feminist action for climate justice. We want technology and innovation for gender equality; and feminist leadership. Small actions can have big impacts in making this vision a reality. On International Women's Day, join Generation Equality and become part of the movement. An equal world is an enabled world. Individually, we're all responsible for our own thoughts and actions - all day, every day. We can actively choose to challenge stereotypes, fight bias, broaden perceptions, improve situations and celebrate women's achievements. The emerging global consensus is that despite some progress, real change has been agonizingly slow for the majority of women and girls in the world. Today, not a single country can claim to have achieved gender equality. Multiple obstacles remain unchanged in law and in culture. Women and girls continue to be undervalued; they work more and earn less and have fewer choices; and experience multiple forms of violence at home and in public spaces.



He also presented a paper on Women's Rights and Gender Equality: Vulnerability of Women HIV in Manipur. He asserted that HIV women largely vulnerable groups of poor family have been waiting the last breath of life. In the one sense, they can't have equal opportunity, equality before law, privacy, liberty, economy and social security and more particularly right to life and human dignity as social stigma and other forms of violence (sexual, physical, verbal) rounded against them. The question of domestic violence against women HIV has also another issue despite numerous countless issues in Manipur. HIV positive women fighting for right to life, fighting for their children, fighting against all odds are many times sexually abused and tortured by people who are considered as saviours to them. When they approach for help, they are welcome and helped only to abuse their rights. Such hapless lamentation of HIV infected women have disclosed only when they are out of tolerance. A number of questions were germinated when it reach to the general public. HIV infected woman who approached for justice to a lawyer and had to sacrifice the chastity of a woman to the justice-provider for her only child. In another human right violation story appeared in the local newspaper, HIV

women seeking ART drugs for life was reportedly lured by a person working in ART centre.

Among the invitees M. Shakhi, President, All Manipur Nupi Marup also made observation on this workshop.

## Statement for International Women's Day

*2020 is the year for Women*

2020 is a massive year for gender equality. And the benefits of gender equality are not just for women and girls, but for everyone whose lives will be changed by a fairer world that leaves no one behind. It's the year for what we call "Generation Equality". With the leadership of civil society, we're mobilizing to realize women's rights, and to mark 25 years of implementing the Beijing Platform for Action.

We're enabling women to influence the decisions about their future. Generation Equality tackles issues of women across generations, from early to late years, with young women and girls at the centre.

We don't have an equal world at the moment and women are angry and concerned about the future. They are radically impatient for change. It's an impatience that runs deep, and it has been brewing for years.

We do have some positive changes to celebrate. For example, there has been a 38 per cent drop in the ratio of maternal deaths since 2000. 131 countries have made legal reforms to support gender equality and address discrimination. Twenty-five years ago, discrimination of women was legislated in many countries.

Today, more than three-quarters of countries have laws against domestic violence in place. And more girls are in school than ever before, with more women in tertiary education than men globally.

But even though there has been progress, no country has achieved gender equality. Our best hasn't been good enough. Challenges remain for all countries, although many of them are not insurmountable.

Meantime, girls are making no secret of their disappointment with the stewardship of our planet, the unabated violence directed against them and the slow pace of change in fulcrum issues like education. For example, despite improved school enrolment, 1 in 10 young women today are still unable to read and write. This has to change in order for girls to fully own their power, take their place in the world, and play their vital role in technology and innovation.

Another priority target for our impatience is the lack of women at the tables of power. Three-quarters of all parliamentarians in the world are men. A proven solution is to introduce legally binding quotas for women's representation. Nearly 80 countries have already successfully done so and a few States have gender-balanced cabinets and explicitly feminist policies. This is a desirable trend that we need to see more of in both public and private sectors, where overall the proportion of women in managerial positions remains around 27 per cent, even as more women graduate from universities.

The same goes for women at the peace table, where the vast majority of the negotiators and signatories are men. We know women's involvement brings more lasting peace agreements, but women continue to be marginalized. Women's groups and human rights defenders face persecution yet are ready to do more. For this they desperately need increased security, funding and resources.

My greatest impatience is with unmoving economic inequality. Women and girls use triple the time and energy of boys and men to look after the household. That costs them equal opportunities in education, in the job market and in earning power. It's a driver of repeating poverty. Young women raising families are 25

per cent more likely than men to live in extreme poverty, affecting millions of young children, with impacts that last into later life for both mother and child. The solution includes good policies that promote more equality in childcare responsibilities and that provide state support to families, and those who work in the informal economy.

So, though we are radically impatient, we are not giving up and we are hopeful. We have growing support from allies and partners who are ready to tackle barriers against gender equality. We see the driving will for change across generations and countries. We are locating issues that unite us and that offer opportunities to disrupt the status quo. Lessons learnt in the last 25 years have shown us what is needed to accelerate action for equality. Generation Equality is one of our answers and together, we are that generation.





### Women's Rights and Gender Equality: Vulnerability of Women HIV in Manipur

HIV women largely vulnerable groups of poor family have been waiting the last breath of life. In the one sense, they can't have equal opportunity, equality before law, privacy, liberty, economy and social security and more particularly right to life and human dignity as social stigma and other forms of violence (sexual, physical, verbal) rounded against them.
