




The key note address given by Shri S.N. Pradhan, Additional DG (NEZ), Guwahati and ADG (R), Imphal, PIB &ROB, Ministry of Information &Broadcasting, Government of India enlighten the web gathering about the various Central sponsored schemes on Women and Child Development. He further said Poshan Abhiyan, launched by the Prime Minister Shri Narendra Modi on 8<sup>th</sup> March 2018, has reached a long way in ensuring wider people's participation and endeavours to improve nutritional outcomes.

Speaking in the webinar as resource person Shri Ngangom Uttam, Director, Social Welfare, Government of Manipur highlighted the works done in Manipur under Poshan Abhiyan like distribution of 4 saplings of nutrition rich plants per Anganwadi Centres (AWC) in the Aspirational Districts to be done under the supervision of Local Panchayats He also said medicinal plants will also be planted in association with Ayush Department, Government of Manipur. He strongly called upon conservation of already rich forest nutrition of Manipur.

Dr. Ngangom Liklaileima Devi, Asst. Prof. Department of Human Rights, SKWC, Nambol, as a resource person spoke on the rich forest nutrition of Manipur. She said food security should come with nutritional security as it will help fighting malnutrition. She spoke about encouraging forest garden which is purely organic along with a healthy ecosystem.
