On the first day - the international seminar was presided by Prof. Manori K Weeratunga, Department of Demography, University of Colombo, Sri Lanka



Giving the welcome address by Binapani Chingtham, Coordinator IQAC stated that this International Seminar –Education in the COVID Era is organized by Internal Quality Assurance Cell & Human Resource and Research Innovation Centre, S. Kula Women’s College, Nambol, Manipur and sponsored by: UGC-STRIDE-C1. **Altogether 112** participants including paper presenters were on the seminar. The seminar has three subthemes - Shifting paradigm of Education in new normal; Effectiveness of virtual classes during Lockdown and; Role of ICT as alternate means of education during COVID pandemic.

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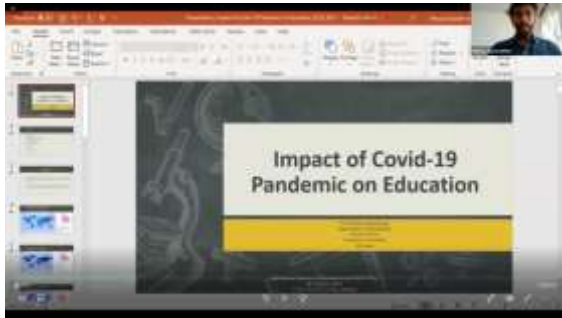

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Giving the keynote address, Prof. Manori K Weeratunga, presented a research paper through her nominated reader on “Impact of COVID 19 Pandemic on Education”.



Hansa Jayarathne stated that, it is indeed a great pleasure for me to write this message for International Seminar on Education in the COVID 19 Era which will be held on 26th and 27th February 2021 at the S. Kula Women’s College, Nambol which is jointly organized by IQAC & Human Resource and Research Innovation Centre, SKWC. I am very much thankful to the Organizers for inviting me as

the Keynote Speaker in this very memorable day. The conference has focused on the very timely sub-themes as Shifting paradigm of education in new normal, Effectiveness of virtual classes during lockdown, Role of ICT as alternate means of education during COVID pandemic and other related theme of education in present situation. The education system of the world has been severely affected by the COVID-19 pandemic. This can be considered as the biggest disorder in the education systems in the history, upsetting nearly 1.6 billion learners in more than 190 countries and all continents. However, the impact is higher for developing countries. Closure of schools and other learning spaces have jammed 94 per cent of the world’s student population, up to 99 per cent in low and lower-middle income countries.



Prof. Jyotiraj Pathak, Head, Dept. of Political Science, Bodoland University chaired technical sessions where different papers were presented to discussed the matter seriously

Prof. Haobijam Vokendro S. Head, Dept. of Anthropology, Rajiv Gandhi University, Rono Hills, Doimukh, Arunachal Pradesh, stated that During Covid19 crisis, all have suffered in one way or another. Students who could not attend physical presence for their regular classes because of the lockdown have compelled to resort to online teaching. The limitations, advantages, issues and challenges of teaching and learning process for both the teachers and taught and few suggestions to improve the process is being introspected and discussed.



Professor Vikas Singh, Department of Political Science, Himachal Pradesh University, Shimla, talk on “Role of ICT as alternative means of Education during Covid-19 Pandemic”. He asserted that in the present educational system online learning is playing an important role through information and communication technology in the form of distance education. The circumstances which occurred during covid-19 pandemic have given an indispensable role to the

use of technology for teaching and learning in educational institutions not only in India but in the maximum part of the world.

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Dr. Biswajit Choudhury, Assistant Professor (Stage II), Department of Political Science, Handique Girls' College, Guwahati presented on: Prospects and Problems of Virtual Class during Nation-Wide Lockdown Period: A Case Study of Handique Girls' College, Guwahati He stated that Handique Girls' College, Guwahati was established in the year 1939. At present the College has 3500 students with 20 Departments and 130 teaching staff. The announcement of nation-wide lockdown due to increasing number of Covid-19 cases in India in particular and the world as a whole, the country experienced a new situation which was out of everyone's prediction. March 23rd 2020 onwards no movement, nothing happened. It effected badly in social, political, economic, cultural and educational life of the people. The traditional method of teaching was never happened. The teaching-learning and evaluation processes were completely stopped. People were struggling for life. Few months later, educational apps for virtual learning were developed. Central government also instructed time to time for the use of it. But at this juncture some problems were also occurred. Mostly access for this virtual mode of learning becomes challenging for the people of developing countries like India as a whole and Assam in particular. This paper is trying to highlight the major issues of concern related to merits and demerits of virtual mode of learning by engaging survey method. This study carried out sample survey among the teaching staffs and students of Handique Girls' College, Guwahati.)



Dr. Gyanabati Khuraijam, Assistant Professor, Dept. of Management, Humanities & Social Sciences, NIT Agartala and Dr. Yumnam Oken Singh, Assistant Professor Dept. of Basic Science & Humanities, College of Horticulture and Forestry, Pasighat, Arunachal Pradesh, Presented on E-education and ICT in India: The Only Way Forward in COVID-19 Pandemic. They

stated that E-learning with the help of ICT tools has been going on for the last many years but its importance has suddenly increased manifold after the Covid-19 induced lockdowns and travel restrictions in most parts of the world. The present paper studies e-learning and its implications at present. It finds that India still lags behind majority of the countries around the world in terms of ICT infrastructure and adoption, both in schools and higher education. As the pandemic is a definite problem, the study calls for a Problem-Based Learning in the form of online education and implementation of a robust Learning Management System (LMS) in the educational institutes. The teaching community should be well acquainted with various ICT tools for a smooth and efficient online learning and it needs a strong systems support as well. Online learning has its own deficiencies but its benefits far outweigh it. Virtual learning through SWAYAM (both Online and TV), CBSE, NPTEL, IGNOU, etc. is good; teaching through video-conference tools like ZOOM, JIOMEET, Google Meet, Webex, etc. is well. Still, it is not enough. The education system also needs a better system to monitor and assess the outcome of learning.

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Dr. Tekcham Kriyananda Singh, *Department of chemistry, Imphal College, Imphal* presented on Effectiveness of Online/ Virtual Teaching- Learning Educational System during COVID-19 Pandemic Lockdown Period. He mentioned that Education is a tool which provides knowledge, skills, information, enables to know right duties towards society as well as the nation. It gives the ability to think with reason, pursue dreams and aspiration in life, job skills and live a respectable life in the society. Indian Education institutions are mainly based on traditional classroom or face to face teaching- learning process. Due to covid-19 pandemic, it changes and challenges in education community. Online teaching system explored to designing and organising better learning environment with the use of modern digital technologies online teaching- learning requirement has increased in higher education day by day. During Covid-19 pandemic, it affected educational system worldwide, including closure of schools, colleges and universities and forced educators to shift to online method of teaching. The essentials of online classes at the time of Covid-19 pandemic period have been discussed. Effectiveness of online teaching in modern education in global context has also been explored. Collaborative learning, economic factors, placement opportunities, time factors in relation to education are also analysed.



Dr. Wakambam Ranibai Devi, Asst. Professor, Department of Political Science, Modern College, Imphal presented on COVID-19 Pandemic & E- learning and the Digital Divide: Its implications on the education system in India. She stated that The government should think of ways and means to robust the digital infrastructure as well as to accelerate the digital India initiative. Hence, investing more on digital learning technology is of utmost importance, in the present scenario even though there is an actual increase in the investments in the education sector. Moreover, Multi-pronged approach (spreading across various ministries and departments) is needed to address these issues. Considering the advantage of the demographic dividend of the country, the country is at higher privilege so as to reap the benefits from the future workforce. But this will only be possible if their rights are enhanced, as mentioned the right to education as guaranteed in the constitution must be redefined so as to fill in the lacunae.

Purnima Devi, Department of Library & Information Science, Manipur University, Canchipur; and Th. Priyogopal Singh, NET Research Scholar, Department of Library & Information Science, Manipur University, Canchipur and

Librarian, S. Kula Women's College, Nambol, Manipur presented on Education in the COVID Era. They mentioned that Education is indispensable component of the society in the whole world. Introducing the theme of the Seminar L. Muhindro asserted that it is to encourage scholars and teachers who are working in the colleges and universities to express their experience /own ideas/thought write-up to impart a meaningful and effective education in different modes (off and on-line). Giving the keynote address Dr. L. Ishwori stated that Blended learning approach is one of the emerging trends in today's world. With the numerous numbers of online resources



available, students can gain access and go deeper into the subject which in turn provides more autonomy to the students of how to learn on their own and set his or her learning goals. Inadequate training of teachers and students will definitely derail the blended learning method. If teachers

are trained and technologies are made available to both the teachers and the students, blended learning simply outweighs the disadvantages.
