## General information

### Guide for Authors

Inviting your valued paper: any papers of social sciences and humanities, based on theoretical, empirical, qualitative and quantitative research outputs; it is multi-disciplinary in nature and produce annually; so all the faculty members and research scholars of any discipline may eligible to write the paper but the context should be very clear and be original. Submissions of paper or any query may be sent to [skjournalss@gmail.com](mailto:skjournalss@gmail.com) and copy to the [khtom79@gmail.com](mailto:khtom79@gmail.com); during February to July of every year so as to enable the publication biannually. The confirmation / acceptance will be sent back to the corresponding author's email.

### Mode of Review

In academic publishing, the goal of **peer review** is to **assess the quality** of articles submitted for publication in a scholarly journal.

Before an article is deemed appropriate to be published in this peer-reviewed international journal, all the paper writers will meet the following process:

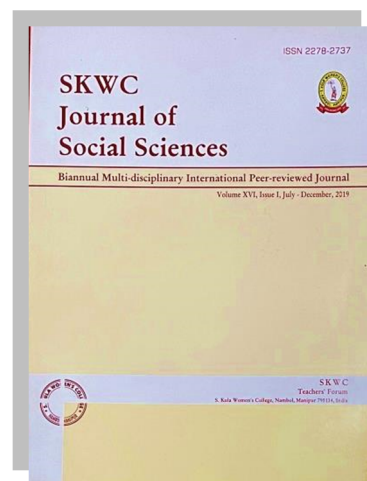
- The author of the article must submit it to the journal editor email who forwards the article to experts in the field. Because the reviewers specialize in the same scholarly area as the author, they are considered the author's peers (hence "peer review").
- These impartial reviewers are charged with carefully evaluating the quality of the submitted manuscript.
- The peer reviewers check the manuscript for accuracy and assess the validity of the research methodology and procedures.
- If appropriate, they suggest revisions. If they find the article lacking in scholarly validity and rigor, they reject it.

This journal will not publish articles that fail to meet the standards established for a given discipline, by reviewer team.

The journal has to maintain quality paper to be a peer review status. So all the paper contributors should care with following preferences and should:

- be original and unpublished work.
- accompany a signed declaration that it has not been published or submitted for publication elsewhere.
- contain, on a separate page, full correspondence details of the author/s such as physical address, affiliation institution, current position, telephone number, fax and email.
- keep all the tables and figures at the end of the paper citing appropriate locations in the text.
- only if necessary, notes should be endnotes and numbered serially at the end of the paper
- provide references with date and page number in the text in parenthesis. Example: (Srinivas,1966: 170).
- have a complete and accurate bibliography, not numbered, placed at the end of the text and not at the bottom of the page as they appear.

- be in the range of 6,000-8,000 words.
- have a summary / abstract of 150 words with provide 4-6 keywords.
- enclose a short Curricular Vitae
