ORDINANCE

BACHELOR OF ARTS AND BACHELOR OF SCIENCE (SIX-SEMESTER SYSTEM)

There shall be a six-semester (three year) course of study leading to the award of Bachelor of Arts (Honours)/Bachelor of Science (Honours) degree. Each semester shall consist of 90 working days.

1. Eligibility:

- A student who has passed 10+2 examination of Council of Higher Secondary Education, Manipur, or equivalent examination recognised by Manipur University is eligible for admission to BA/B Sc course.
- 2. A student of Bachelor of Arts and Bachelor of Science shall offer the following subjects:
 - 1) Modern Indian Language (Any one of the following):
 - (i) Bengali, (ii) Hindi, (iii) Hmar, (iv) Manipuri, (v) Mizo, (vi) Nepali, (vii) Paite (in the 1st and 2nd semesters)

 OR

 General English

 In the 1st and 2nd semesters
 - 2) a) Regional Development (Northeast) (In 3rd semester)
 - b) Environmental Studies (in 4th Semester)
 - 3) Elective and Honours subjects (Any three of the following):

- No student shall be allowed to opt Biochemistry/Chemistry/Botany/Zoology unless he/she has passed the 10+2 (Higher Secondary/Senior Secondary) examination with Chemistry.
- ii) No student shall be allowed to opt Computer Science/Mathematics/Physics/ Statistics unless he/she has passed the 10+2 (Higher Secondary/Senior Secondary) examination with Mathematics.
- iii) No student shall be allowed to opt Electronics/Physics unless he/she has passed the 10+2 (Higher Secondary/Senior Secondary) examination with Physics.

For a subject involving Practical/Laboratory classes:

- a) the practical examination will carry at least 30% overall weightage.
- b) for an elective paper of 100 marks comprising of Theory and Practical components, the distribution of marks shall be, generally:

Theory - 75 marks Practical - 25 marks.

However, for certain subjects, (e.g. Geography), a different distribution may be adopted.

.c) Honours Paper III in the 5th Semester and Honours Paper VI in the 6th Semester may be practical papers.

Details of marks distribution shall be as provided in the respective syllabus.

- 6. Eligibility to appear at the End-Semester Examination:
- 6.1 A student who has studied a regular course of study for a semester in an affiliated or permitted college may be admitted to the end-semester examination provided the student has attended not less than 75 perent of the lectures delivered, including practicals.
- 6.2 A student who has enrolled himself/herself in more than one college/institute simultaneously shall not be admitted into the end semester examinations.

7. Promotion:

- 7.1 A student who has passed all the papers of the semester examination will be promoted to the next higher semester.
 - 7.2 A student who has failed in one or two papers in a semester may also be promoted to the next higher semester provided that in no case a student will be promoted to next higher semester if he/she has more than four failed papers at a time.
 - 8. Admission into degree and award of certificate:

A degree under the seal of the university shall be awarded to a student who has passed all the papers of all the semester examinations.

- 9. Classification and Class and Grade:
- 9.1 A student who has passed all the six semesters in regular attempt shall be placed in the class "Honours with Distinction" if he/she secured at least 85% marks in aggregate of all the subjects in all the semesters.
- 9.2 For the award of class and grade (except the class of "Honours with Distinction"), the marks obtained in the subject of Honours (Honours papers and corresponding elective papers) will be counted.
 - E.g: For a student offering History as the Honours subject, the marks obtained in the Honours (History) Papers and elective (History) Papers shall be counted.
- 9.2.1 A student who secured 60% or above marks in the Honours subject (Honours paper and corresponding elective papers) shall be placed in First Class Honours.
- 9.2.2 A student who has secured 45% or more marks, but below 60% marks, will be placed in Second Class Honours.
- 9.2.3 A student who has passed all the papers but secures less than 45% marks will be placed in "Pass only" class.
- 10. Admission of the unsuccessful and absentee candidates:

A student who was admitted into a semester examination, but could not pass/could not be promoted to the next higher semester may be permitted to appear at the next available regular semester examination as a casual student on payment of necessary prescribed fee.

11. Notwithstanding anything contained in the above clasues a student must complete the course within a continuous span of ten semesters from his/her initial admission.

OFFICE ORDERS NO. 2062 Dated, the 18th April, 2013

No.MU/2-6/2006: In anticipation of the approval of the Academic Council, the Vice Chancellor is pleased to approve the following amendment of the Sub-Clause 7.2(v) of Clause 7 'Promotion' of the BA/BSc/BCom Ordinance, 2010 as under:

"A student who has appeared at the fifth semester examination may be allowed to attend sixth semester classes immediately after he/she has appeared at the fifth semester examination and will be allowed to appear the sixth semester examination if he/she has a maximum of four back papers only in first, second, third, fourth and fifth semester examinations taken together".

Other sub-clauses of the Office Order No.570 dated, the 23rd August, 2011 shall remain the same.
