HISTORY:

Founded by the Late Shrava Shree Sanasam Kula Singh of Yaiskul in 1981 and located at Kongkhampat of Nambol under Bishnupur District away from the hustle and bustle of city life and noisy roads, 15 km. away from Imphal towards the south, the S. Kula Women's College stands as a pearl of beauty in the wilderness, completely reorganized to conform to the standards and requirements of a modern college. This Women's English medium institution is an amalgamation of high standard in academics, coupled with a number



of Job Oriented and personality development programmes designed to cater to the individual, societal and global needs.

The college is a Government Grant-in-aid college and was conferred the status of "Colleges with Potential for Excellence" by the University Grants Commission in 2006 and accredited by National Assessment and Accreditation Council (NAAC) to "A" Grade with CGPA of 3.03 on four point scale in April, 2012. The College was also supported to 9 (nine) Science Subjects by the DBT, Government of India under STAR College Scheme in March, 2013. The college is under the management of a Governing Body constituted under Manipur Education Code, 1982 and the staff consists of experienced and qualified teachers who are appointed on the recommendation of a regular Selection Committee. The college has a total campus Networking with LAN interconnecting all the computers in the campus with 2Mbps Broadband Connectivity under NMEICT and 1 Mbps 1:1 dedicated connectivity from Bharati Airtel and WIFI Connectivity from Reliance JIO. The Library is automated with SOUL 2.0 Network version and digitalization of the library is under the process. The library has subscribed more than 55000 e-resources (e-books and e-journals) under the scheme of National Mission of Education through ICT. The college has adopted a total ICT based teaching-learning and evaluation process. Infact, Computer is the life of the college.

♦ Intake Capacity for B.Ed. Programme:

The intake capacity of this college as permitted by the NCTE is 50 (fifty) only for the Academic Session 2022-23.

Admission Policy :

- (i) **Selection Procedure**: The mechanism of selection procedure for admission to B.Ed. in this college is monitored by a panel of teachers. The minimum eligible marks required for admission to B.Ed. course is 50% at Graduate level for general and 45% for SC/ST/PWD/Sports Persons). To maintain transparency and quality, screening of candidates shall be made on merit on the basis of marks obtained in the qualifying examination and entrance examination which comprises of general English and content area of Arts and Science stream. The details of the entrance test either online or offline will be informed to the candidates at the time of receiving of Admission Forms.
- (ii) **Reservation Policy:** The reservation policy of the State Government for admission to academic institutions as published by Directorate of University and Higher Education will be followed strictly. The reserved category shall comprise of

ST/SC/OBC/MOBC/Physically Challenged/Sports persons. 5% will be reserved for the students passing out from the parent college i.e. S. Kula Women's College.

(iii) Allocation of seats in various subjects: Primary importance will be given to the school base subjects opened in this college. Offering of Optional Courses will also be limited as per subjects opened in this college.



Working Women's Hostel


(c) SWIMMING POOL

(d) INDOOR STADIUM


The College has two well furnished Indoor Stadiums; Category-I and Category-II where the students can play all the indoor games, Weight-lilfting and Gymnasium.

(a) Campus:

(d) Laboratories:



The College has well furnished and well equipped Central Modernized Laboratories including Computer Science, Chemistry, Botany, Zoology, Physics, Psychology, Educational Technology, Home Science, Food Science, Fisheries, Biotechnology, Bioinformatics, Multi-media Language Laboratory where there are facilities for UST Projectors, Slide Projector, CCTV attached Advanced Microscopes, Microprosessor based Gas Chromatograph, Atomic Absorpsion Spectrometer, HPLC, UV-VIS Spectrophotometer, Food Processing Machineries, High Speed Refrigerated Centrifuge, Food Processing Machineries, B.O.D. Incubators, Laminar Air Flows, DeepFreezers, ELISA Readers, Projection Microscopes, Phase Contrast Trinocular Microscopess and Binocular Research Microscopes, Fume Hood etc. Micro-technique methods of analysis are introduced in the Laboratories. The Computer Centre, Gas Chromatograph room, Culture Rooms, Bioinformatics Cnetre, Bio-Tech Hub, AAS Room, Central Instrumentation Centre are all air conditioned.

(e) Networking:

The college has campus a Wifi Campus supported by Reliance Jio and Networking with Local Area Network (LAN) with connectivity through 1:1 dedicated 2 Mbps Bharti Airtel.

The college has a air conditioned Bioinformatics Infrastructure Facility (BIF) Centre equipped with 30 numbers of

Co-ordinator, namely Dr. W. Robindro Singh who is trained with DOEACC "A" Level in Bioinformatics. Two Research Assistants, one Traineeship and one Studentship are working in the centre for Data Base Development. The BIF Centre is supported by DBT, Government of India.

(g) Advanced Level DBT Biotech Hub

The college has established an air conditioned Biotech Hub under DBT, Government of India under supervision of a qualified Coordinator where a JRF is working for Promotion of Research Activities. The Hub is equipped with a number of sophisticated equipments.

(h) ICT Infrastructure

Innovative methods of teaching, learning and evaluation are totally adopted by the college with the help of the above ICT infrastructure. For back up of the power supply the college has one Diesel Generating Set of 125 KVA.

UNIVERSITY GRANTS COMMISSION SPONSORED SCHEMES:

a) Remedial Course:

Remedial Coaching Classes for the slow learners are provided.

b) Remedial Coaching Classes for SC/ST/OBC/Minorities:

Special remedial coaching classes are held for Scheduled Caste, Scheduled Tribe, Minorities and OBC students..

c) Remedial Coaching Classes for SC/ST/OBC/Minorities for entry in services:

Remidial Coaching Classes are held for SC/ST/OBC/Minority Students for entry in their services. All the candidates who are not studying in this college can also avail this facility.

d) COHSSIP:

Innovative Programme like Seminar, Creative Writing, Book Review, Field Study, Audio-Video etc. are undertaken under the College Humanities and Social Science Improvement Programme.

e) Courses opened under NSQF (National Skills Qualifications Framework):

- i) **Community College**: The college has started two year Advanced Diploma Courses in i) Food Processing & Engineering and ii) Fashion Technology.
- ii) **B.Voc. Programme:** The college has started three year Degree Courses in B.Voc. i) Food Processing & Engineering, ii) Fashion Technology, iii) Information Technology and iv) Catering and Hotel Management.
- f) Vocational Education: Vocational Training has been provided to the students about Food Processing and Preservation, Fisheries, Dress Making, Computer Applications etc. under the Vocational Education programme. The College arranges educational tours to places of historical and educational interest inside and outside Manipur as a regular feature of their studies.

g) Extension Education/Field Action Poogramme:

It is an innovative programme taken by the College to extend knowlege and education to the surrounding Communities. Human Rights Studies Centre, Women Studies Centre and NSS Units are taking active roles in Field Action Programme. The teachers and

students of this college are involved in the programme. The Students of B.Ed. Department also participate in the School Exposure and Community Contact Programme as a part of Curriculum.

h) Career Oriented Programmes:

The Career Oriented Courses upto Advanced Diploma Level in Fashion Designing, E-Commerce, Secretarial Practice & Office Management, Food Science & Quality Control, Industrial Fish and Fisheries, Computer Application, Microbiology in Food & Environmental, Bioinformatics in Biodiversity, Mushroom Cultivation, Clinical Biochemistry, Computer & Information Technology and Spoken & Communicative English are run as ad-on programme which may offered by the students of B.Ed. parallel to their normal B.Ed. course.

i) Inovative Programme:

An Inovative programme(Teaching cum Research in emerging areas) is undertaken by the Department of Biotechnology in the Bioremediation of water (Purification of Pond water by culturing Azolla) and a publication of the project was brought out.

j) Human Rights Studies Centre:

Foundation, Certificate as well as Undergraduate Courses in Human Rights and Duties Education upto Honours level are introduced in the college. A Certificate Course in Human Development is alos introduced in the

centre. A research work in the promotion of Ethics and Human Values is also undertaken by the centre. These Courses can be offered by the students of this college as add-on course and all other outsider students. Organization of awareness programme, extension activities and field action programme are one of the objectives of the centre. The centre has also brought out several publications in the area s related to Human Rights.

k) Women's Studies Centre:

A Women's Study Centre is introduced in the college with the financial support of the UGC which is upgraded to the second phase. The centre has introduced a Certificate Course in Women's Studies. The centre



is also conducting a research work in women related issues and brought out several publications. Organization of awareness programme is also one of the objective of the centre.

1) Colleges with Potential for Excellence:

The UGC has conferred the college the status of "Colleges with Potential for Excellence" in 2006. Under this award the UGC has sanctioned Rs. 35.00 lakhs in the 1st phase, Rs. 50.00 lakhs in the 2nd phase and Rs.100.00 lakhs in the 3rd phase. Under the above scheme the UGC has identified two Departments i.e. Biotechnology and Computer Science as Star Departments.

m) Career, Counselling and Placement Cell:

The college has esteablished a Career , Counselling and Placement Cell with the financial support of the UGC. The centre is under the supervision of an experience qualified teacher and counsels the students for their career options and placements.

n) Day Care Centre:

The college has established a Day Care Centre with the Financial Assistance of the UGC. The objective of the centre is to provide facilities to the minor kids of the staff of the college during the college hour.

o) Research Activities:

Most of all the faculties are undergoing major and minor Research Projects of the UGC, ICSSR, DBT etc. The UGC has also awarded "STRIDE" Component One to the College to conduct trans disciplinary research activities run under the body of "Human Resource and Research Innovation Centre". The Science Students were also undergoing Basic Scientific Research works sponsored by the College.

STUDENTS AMENITIES AND PROGRESSION

I. Government Scholarships:

- a) **National Scholarship :** The students securing 60% and above in the H.S.E. or equivalence Examniation are eligible for award of National Scholarships.
- b) **State Merit Scholarship :** Students securing 60% and above in the H.S.E. or equivalent Examinations are illegible State Merit Scholarship.
- c) **NEC Scholarship**: Students of Biotechnology, Food Processing Technology and BCA securing 60% and above are illegible for NEC Scholarship.
- d) **Post Metric Scholarship for S.T. & S.C.:** Students belonging to S.C. and S.T. will get scholarship from the Directorate of Development of Tribal and Backward Classess.
- e) **Post Metric Scholarship for Other Backward Classes:** Students belonging to the O.B.C.(Non-creamy layer) will get Scholarship from the Directorate of Minorities and Other Backward Classes.

II. National Service Scheme:



- vii) Students who have attended less than 60% attendance including practicals shall be treated as dis-collegiate and they shall not be allowed to appear at the Examinations conducted by the Manipur University.
