Manipur:

Manipur has over 2000 years of long ancient history. In the earlier period, Manipur had been princely kingdom, ruled by the king as a full-fledged country. In the history of the ancient record Manipur lost its independence and was ruled by the Awa (Burma) now Myanmar from 1819 to 1825. With the help of the British, Manipur regained its independence from the hands of the Awans. From this time Manipur established its relation with the British. After the war against the British, Manipur had lost its Independence in the hands of the British in April 1891. Then Manipur was occupied by the British as a part of the British Empire upto 1947. On the 14th August, 1947 Manipur became free from the British rule. Again on the 20th September, 1949 Manipur has forcibly been annexed to India. Then on the 15th October, 1949 Manipur became a part of Indian Union as a Union Territory and became a state on 21st January, 1971. Manipur has lived its own lifestyle, religion, culture, topology, administration, philosophy, language, social structure, dress code, social norm. Manipur is a state in North Eastern India, with the city of Imphal as its capital. It is bounded by the Indian states of Nagaland to the north, Mizoram to the south, and Assam to the west; Myanmar (Saigaing Region) and Chin State) lies to its east. Manipur has been at the crossroads of Asian economic and cultural exchange for more than 2,500 years. It has long connected the Indian subcontinent to Southeast Asia, China.

Sight Seeing

Some specific historical places on the same way of the college shall be visited on the Day -2, (30 April 2020) the visit will start by 14.30 hrs. sharp till 17.00 hrs. Japan War Memorial Complex, (India Peace Memorial) is situated at Red Hill (Maibam Lokpa Ching) of Manipur, in Bishnupur district, at around 17 kms from Imphal. The place was an action-packed location where a fierce battle took place between the Allied Forces and the Japanese Forces during WW II. The peace memorial was constructed by a Japanese War Veteran Lt. General Iwaichi Fujiwara in memory of Japanese martyrs who gave up their lives in that battle. The memorial has been sponsored by the Japanese government.

The INA Martyr's Memorial complex is a war memorial at Moirang, India, dedicated to the soldiers of the Indian National Army. The main feature of the complex is a reconstruction of the INA's memorial to its fallen soldiers as it stood in Singapore, before its destruction at the hands of British-Indian Army sappers in 1945. The INA along with a library and an auditorium and a statue of Subhas Chandra Bose.

Loktak Lake, The largest fresh water lake in Northeast India is a marvel of nature. It has multiple ring-shaped land masses floating on it that are known as **phumdis** or **phumshongs**. Some of these are big enough to accommodate a couple of huts inhabited by local families. The obvious means of transport between these small islands are boats. The lake is referred to as a miniature island sea and a bird's-eye view of this water body is simply indescribable. These **phumdis** are largely made up of weeds and are surrounded by colourful water plants and water chestnuts.
