Concept Note:

Health is one of the most important indicators of development in any types of society. Community health and hygiene help to prevent infectious diseases from spreading throughout a neighborhood, school/college compound, office space, and other social spaces. On a more global scale, community behaviour, and community hygiene help save lives of the world's children and youth population. The environment is defined as the surroundings of a physical system that may interact with other systems by exchanging mass and energy. All living beings and non-living things fall under the natural environment. The environment is the surrounding that we live in, so it is our responsibility to protect it from destruction. Environmental pollution is one of the greatest problems that human society is facing today. Air, water, and soil form the three basic areas of environmental pollution. When there is an undesirable change in the surroundings that has harmful effects on plants and animals, it leads to environmental pollution. A pollutant is a substance that causes pollution. We can have pollutants in liquid, solid, or gaseous forms. A substance becomes a pollutant when its concentration is greater than the natural abundance and this increase in concentration is either due to human activities or natural phenomena. Some pollutants can be degraded and rapidly broken down by natural processes similar to the degradation of vegetables. We also have pollutants which take decades to degrade, once released cannot be easily removed. For example, DDT, plastic materials, heavy metals and nuclear waste. Pollutants are classified as notable pollutants, fund pollutants, and light pollutants. The concentration of pollutants is measured to determine risk assessment in public health.
